SATAN'S YARD SALE

DISCOURAGEMENT - a deterrent to every good work! A soldier going among the troops saying, "we're outnumbered, we can't win, we're all gonna die!" will defeat an army without firing a shot. The effect of a negative report can be seen in (Nu. 13:14) grasshoppers or giant killers?

PROCRASTINATION - This rightfully belongs to Satan since God never says to wait or put-off our obedience to Him. As long as Satan can cause mankind to believe, "There's plenty of time," the majority will remain unprepared.
